Truth & Reconciliation Week – Orange Shirt Day



NATIONAL DAY FOR TRUTH AND RECONCILIATION ORANGE SHIRT DAY SEPTEMBER 30

Friday, September 30, 2022 is the Orange Shirt/ National Day for Truth and Reconciliation marks the annual day of reflection on the 150,000 Indigenous children of who attended and experienced abuse in the Indian Residential School System, those who died there, and the ongoing impact on Survivors and communities. The United Church of Canada (or its predecessor denominations) ran 15 schools between 1849 to 1969. The United Church apologized to Indigenous peoples in 1986, and 1998. established a Healing Fund in 1994, and revised the Church crest in 2012 to reflect the colours of the Medicine Wheel, including the Mohawk words meaning "All my relations" similar to the crest's Latin *ut omnes unum sint* meaning "That all may be one" taken from the Gospel of John 17:21.

The work of reconciliation or "making us one"/ "all my relations" has only just begun. It is a faithful process that can help reconcile settlers'

descendants with Indigenous people and genuinely live in the way of Jesus. Miguel A. De La Torre, A Cuban American theologian, states in *Reading the Bible from the Margins* "In Matthew 5:23-24, Jesus instructs the faithful to move

beyond religiosity.... "If then, you offer your gift on the altar, and there remember that your

companion has something against you leave your gift there before the altar and go. First be recon-

ciled to your companion, and then come offer your gift." The emphasis is not whether the person "remembers committing the offense but, rather, on whether the offended party had a complaint against the worshiper. The responsibility is to seek reconciliation before coming to God once one is made aware that an offense exists."



Reconciliation means action, moving forward, and learning about Canadian history from the Indigenous perspective. Reading the <u>Truth</u> and <u>Reconciliation Calls to Action</u>, the <u>United Nations Declaration on the Rights of</u> <u>Indigenous Peoples</u>, books on the <u>Treaties in</u> <u>Historical and Modern Contexts | Curated by</u> <u>Treaty Relations Commission of Manitoba</u> and <u>fiction by Indigenous authors in</u>

e Libraries Manitoba through your local public library membership might be a place to start. Indigenous Canada, a free course from the University of Alberta, and participating in the coming <u>Circles of Reconciliation</u> in Brandon might be other learning and sharing opportunities. Reconciliation is liberation for the marginalized and the dominant society.

"They (the dominant society) are indoctrinated to believe they deserve or earn or have a right to power and privilege. They are trapped into living up to the false idea of superiority and so required the same liberation yearned for by the disenfranchised." – Miguel De La Torre.

End Racism. Build Peace

Each one of us needs to do what we can.

ON AND It seems there's a day set aside for everything under the sun: World Nerd Day, Pistacte FUND chio Day, and Squirrel Appreciation Day to name a few. There are so many special

days that we can become immune to them. But when September 21 rolls around every year, it's important to tune in. The International Day of Peace was initiated by the United Nations over 40 years ago and is ob-

served around the world on September 21. The theme this year is "End Racism. Build Peace." Why?

"Racism continues to poison institutions, social structures, and everyday life in every society. It continues to be a driver of persistent inequality. And it continues to deny people their fundamental human rights. It destabilizes societies, undermines democracies and erodes the legitimacy of governments," says António Guterres, United Nations Secretary General.

News emerging from Ukraine and fallout from the COVID-19 pandemic perfectly illustrate Guterres' point.

As people fled Ukraine, social media feeds became flooded with a deluge of reports outing the mistreatment and abuse of people of colour at the borders. Countless reports told the ugly tale of people of colour prevented from crossing borders while White Ukrainians were ushered to safety. Similarly, racism reared its ugly head during the pandemic. Anti-Asian rhetoric surged alongside COVID-19, and statistics emerged revealing that people of colour were more likely to be hospitalized and die from the virus.

There can be no peace without justice. Each one of us needs to do what we can.

"We all have a role to play in fostering peace. And tackling racism is a crucial way to contribute," reads the United Nation's website. "We can work to dismantle the structures that entrench racism in our midst. We can support movements for equality and human rights everywhere. We can speak out against hate speech—both offline and online. We can promote anti-racism through education and reparatory justice."




